- 1. Enclosure (1) is forwarded for use by BCNR in acting on the subject petition. The log book was examined during the initial search for records, but the entry pertaining to Kenneth LeBrun was not discovered because it was thought that the log book entries were made at or near the time of the offense. Subsequent examination revealed that the entries in the log book were made at or near the time that final action was taken (i.e. when demerits were awarded, when a qualified resignation was approved, or when the final decision to involuntarily separate was made).
- 2. Despite continued efforts, no copy of the instruction governing the administrative conduct system, which was in effect at the time of Mr. LeBrun's conduct action, could be located in the archives of the Naval Academy. A copy of the conduct instruction effective 23 August 1967 was located and is provided as enclosure (2) in the event it may be of some assistance to BCNR in resolving the matter at hand.
- 2. BCNR requested that RADM Sheldon Kinney, former Commandant of Midshipmen, submit a declaration to assist in resolution of the matter. Enclosure (3) is RADM Kinney's declaration.

I have reviewed your letter of February 21, 1994. I can assure you that the copies of pages from a Class "A" Log provided under cover of CDR Hancock's January 27, 1994, letter are genuine.


The log book from which they were obtained was found in the historical files of the Conduct Office. This particular log book was maintained by the conduct office, not by personnel assigned to watches, and used as an informal method of recording separation level offenses.

The log book entries reflected the date of the offense, the identity of the midshipman involved and the final disposition. The information was not discovered during our prior searches for information because the information was recorded at the time of final disposition rather than at or near the time of the offense.

Copies of the pages from the log book have also been provided to the Board for Correction of Naval Records for use in adjudicating your petition.
